

### Other Circumstances:

- Patients were unable to afford \$4 copay and we continued to provide meds.
- Patients unaware of Medicaid coverage.
- To maintain medication compliance, enrollees were allowed to remain in the free pharmacy program through the end of their certification term.
- No primary care provider was assigned.

Fifty-three members (77%) of the total NCAFCC membership (69) completed

the Medicaid Expansion Survey for the second quarter.

### Other Circumstances:

- The earliest appointment with assigned provider was more than a month out.
- Patients were unaware of Medicaid coverage.
- Patients needed assistance with obtaining medications until seen by a Medicaid provider.
- Patients had transportation issues.

Fifty-one members (74%) of the total NCAFCC membership (69) completed

the Medicaid Expansion Survey for the third quarter.
