

President Trump's Executive Orders

On January 20, 2025, Donald Trump was inaugurated as the 47th President of the United States, with JD Vance as Vice President. The NAFC is closely monitoring developments during the first 100 days of the new administration, including executive orders, Congressional actions, cabinet appointments, and other policy changes that may impact Free and Charitable Clinics, Pharmacies, State Associations, and the NAFC. What is an Executive Order?

An executive order is a directive from the President that manages operations of the federal government. These orders:

- Do not require Congressional approval.
- Can only be overturned by a sitting U.S. President issuing a new executive order.
- May face legal challenges, which can delay or halt implementation.
